Typewritten Ritual at University Heights Lodge

We have seen Masonic degrees presented and are aware that certain words can be pronounced more than one way. Moreover, by participating in several Master Mason degrees, I have experienced various ritual interpretations. Degree clarification came on January 20, 2011, when University Heights Lodge hosted the Grand Lodge Typewritten Ritual Review.

Several members of University Heights Lodge, plus many brethren from other lodges in the 22nd Masonic District listened to Rt. Wor. Bro. Mitchell L. Alperin, Rt. Wor. Bro. David R. Hildebrandt, and Wor. Bro. Robert D. Stands, as they read from one the two copies of the ritual code that is fully typewritten. Wor. Bro. Stands is a District Education Officer for the 22nd District. Rt. Wor. Bros. Alperin and Hildebrandt are both Deputy District Grand Masters of the 22nd District.

By explaining the code, Grand Lodge tries to achieve consistency among the lodges. What is said and done during degree work should be the same from one lodge to another within Ohio. This beneficial evening gave those in attendance a chance to learn and realize the importance of knowing how Grand Lodge wants the code interpreted.

The Grand Lodge of Ohio has only two copies of the typewritten ritual. Rt. Wor. Bro. Alperin had to guard the copy with his life. Besides having a combination lock, the briefcase that the code travels in is fireproof. It should have a GPS built in for additional security. Next year, it may.

Future reviews will not happen until next year. Those Brethren who wish to learn more about the ritual should attend, especially if all three degrees are fully reviewed.
